<i>Correct conclusion regarding approximate age of the sheep</i>	This should be within approx. 3mths of the correct age if the sheep has less than 8 adult incisors, afterwards 'aged' is adequate.	S
<i>Release the sheep from the casting position.</i>	Allows the animal to move out of the casting position without causing undue alarm or distress.	S
