| <i>Instruments held correctly throughout task</i> | Forceps held chopstick mode Scissors and Needle holders in tripod grip, (thumb and ring finger in handles with index finger extended along shaft) | S |
| <i>Correct handling of needle</i> | Needle held in holder third to midway along its length. Point of needle not touched by fingers or instruments | S |
| <i>Performs simple interrupted suture</i> | Takes bites approximately 7 -10 mm from skin edge Knot is not over incision Suture not too tight or too loose Ends cut leaving at least 1cm of material | S |
| <i>Surgeons knot</i> | Pattern of turns 2-1-1 Throws placed in opposing directions (i.e. not a granny knot or a slip knot) Fluid technique indicating dexterity and practice | S |
| <i>Demonstrates WHO handwash technique</i> | All jewellery removed, sleeves rolled up. Warm water and sufficient soap, hands washed palm to palm, backs of hands, interlaced fingers, both thumbs, finger tips, wrists Hands rinsed and dried thoroughly, tissue used to turn off tap | S |
